National Naval Aviation Museum School Field Trip Information

Dear Educator,

Welcome to the National Naval Aviation Museum! We hope that you and your group will find your visit to be an enjoyable and educational experience. While visiting, please keep in mind the following information.

The National Naval Aviation Museum is open Monday through Sunday from 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Base Access & Identification Requirements:

The Department of Defense (DoD) and the Navy require visitors 18 and older to show a single government-issued identification card. State-issued driving licenses and passports are acceptable. Public access to NAS Pensacola will be available from 9 a.m. through 3 p.m. through the West Gate only on the south end of Blue Angel Parkway. Additionally, vehicle operators must have a valid driver's license, and foreign nationals will need to be escorted by a U.S. citizen.

Giant Screen Theater

Our larger-than-life theater provides an exciting, entertaining, and unparalleled experience that will take you on journeys you've only imagined.

The price for students is \$7.00 (Teachers and Adult chaperones are given complimentary admission on a ratio of 1 adult to 10 students.) Additional adults included in the field trip reservation form we will be given the student rate of \$7.00. All persons not included in the reservation must purchase tickets at standard individual admission rates on a space-available basis.

Free Exploration

After your group's film that you have scheduled, you are welcome to explore other areas of the Museum with your students. Chaperones must remain with students at all times, regardless of age or grade.

Scavenger hunts are available to print from our webpage under the Teacher Resources link. These activities are provided to lead students on a self-guided journey of discovery in the museum.

The Flight Simulator Zone

On the Mezzanine level located on the second floor of the Museum, the Max-Flight Simulators are under your control; these high-definition simulators are capable of 360-degree pitch and roll technology. Price is \$25.00 for two people.

The Motion-Based Simulator is a five-minute, multi-sensory experience that combines a movie-like audiovisual presentation using a high-definition projection screen and surrounds sound. The ride offers two different rides you can choose from in our Flight Simulator. Riders can experience flight in a Navy F/18 Hornet. Price with the film is \$5.00, without the film is \$6.00. Teachers and adult chaperones are given complimentary admission on a ratio of 1 adult to 14 students.

Lunch at the Museum

Backpacks, lunch bags and outside food and drink are not allowed inside the Museum. Picnic areas are available outside, however, space will not be provided inside the museum for picnics interrupted by bad weather. A refreshment area is located in the lobby that offers snacks and drinks, but those refreshments must remain in the designated eating area.

The Gift Shop

Students must be accompanied by a chaperone when visiting the gift shop.

Student Safety

Chaperones must remain with students at all times while visiting the museum. Students should use their indoor voices and their walking feet. Yelling and running are not allowed. Students are not permitted to climb on aircraft or behave in any way that could damage the artifacts or disturb other museum guests.
